In 1950 she moved to Milwaukee where she worked in a factory assembling components for weather balloons. In 1952 she and her uncle, Walter and cousin, Clarice went to Coalinga, CA where Bernice stayed with her sister, Harriet and husband, Lon for part of the winter, seeing the sights and taking it easy. She and Clarice moved to Santa Maria where they had an apartment and Bernice waitressed in a truck stop. In 1953 they traveled to New York and took in all the sights and made many friends. She returned to North Dakota in 1954 due to her dad not being well. She got a job in Williston at Wong's Café where she met her first husband, Rodric G. Belgarde, They married July 26, 1954 and two children were born to them. They lived in Tioga, at her parent's farm in the second house, and then moved to Williston in 1957. Bernice worked at Ditsworth's Charcoal Grille. They divorced in 1963. She had met John Shae, Sr. and his mother, Margaret Britton, and together they purchased the Charcoal Grille in 1965. John and Bernice married on October 3, 1966. One child was born to them. They sold the café in 1972 and bought a dairy farm where they milked 40 cows twice a day for seven years. That was Bernice's favorite job. John passed away in 1991. She was later the assistant Food Services Director at the Kensington in Williston for 17 years, with the last 9 of those being the Food Services Director.

She was diagnosed with Parkinson's in 2005 but maintained her independence up until 2009 when she moved into the Briarwood. While there, she made great friends with the cook who would let her help out, utilizing her amazing cooking and baking talents.
