He then attended Rice University in Houston, TX, on a full music scholarship.

In this young, tender part of his life, Jimmy became ill and never was able to resume a normal life. He still continued to share his gift of music with others, spending a summer with the Fort Peck Summer Theatre and often playing for several churches in Wolf Point and Williston in his adult years.

Jimmy departed his earthly home at Bethel Lutheran Home in Williston, on November 21, 2019. Preceding him were his beloved mother, Fran, and brother Shawn.
