

September 2, 1934 - March 27, 2025




Leland Olson, 90, passed away on Thursday, March 27, 2025 in Hayden, Idaho.

Leland O. Olson, lovingly known as "Ole" to friends and family, lived a life filled with friendships, adventure, and unwavering determination. Born in Brooten, Minnesota, to Harry E. Olson and Olga G. Olson (Eskeland), he spent his early years in Tioga, North Dakota. It was there that he learned the value of hard work, first as a farmhand and later in his lifelong career with Great Northern Railway, now BNSF, where he worked until retirement.

Ole had a rare gift for making friends wherever he went. He never met a stranger, only friends he hadn't spoken to yet.
